We're pleased to announce that we're still on track to deliver the following:



Our Holy Name Hall site is progressing well and the crew at J Harper and Sons are making fantastic progress with the 8 new homes and we hope to have our new tenants moved in before Christmas.



Works are continuing at pace at our site at Monkscroft Villas and the 27 homes being built by E G Carter & Co Ltd are really taking shape. The new homes will all be complete early summer.



We're working closely with our developer partner Newland Homes, to secure three homes on Prestbury Road – these will be completed early winter.

Watch this space – we are in the process of outlining our plans to provide more homes over the next 5 years so that we can meet the demand for more housing in the town.

The theme for this year focused on the 'importance of home' which has never been more important.



Shane Brimfield, our tenant and Vice-Chair of the Board, shares why his home makes him feel safe below:

After 10 years as a long-distance Trucker

in America, Shane and his wife returned to the UK and to Cheltenham where four generations of his family were raised. They discovered, when applying for a Council home that Cheltenham's housing department had been replaced with an ALMO. During their 18 months, they noticed a difference in the way that CBH colleagues dealt with their application and communicated with them too. Passionate about finding out more about this new and improved service, Shane attended a 'CBH Customer Experience Day' to find out more about how CBH homes are managed and was inspired to join the Tenant Scrutiny Improvement Panel (TSIP). For three and a half years he saw how the views of tenants made a difference to CBH Services.

Shane is now a member of the CBH Board, making sure the voice of the tenant is represented. He believes everyone deserves a safe and secure place they can afford and call home.

In Shane's own words:

"In these difficult times I'm really happy to be in a home where I can feel safe. I really enjoy having a back garden and room to walk along the River Chelt so that I can get some fresh air, it really does do wonders for my mental and physical wellbeing.

My home is close to many shops and other amenities which has been so useful during this pandemic. I've been able to stay safe locally and it has meant I haven't had to make any unnecessary trips into town, or further.

It's given me room to grow and has also made it possible for me to do more for others around me and further afield.

I must say that none of this would have been possible if it had not been for the love and hard work of my wife who is not mentioned much in what I do but is a very strong part of why I do it. She has a strong drive to do everything she can to help others and is good at it."

Unfortunately during lockdown we have seen boxes, decorations, rubbish, bikes, bins, scooters and even a fridge left in communal areas, posing a real hazard. If you see anyone using these spaces in this

way, please let your Tenancy Management Officer know by calling **0800 408 0000**.

With our help and the support of our local partners we were able to turn this dream into a reality. Since then the group, known as the 'Happy Potters' have continued to thrive, helping each other to grow vegetables and plants.

Another allotment in Clevedon Square has also been set up with our help, by a resident who was keen to bring their community together. Run by an amazing group of volunteers and families all passionate about having a safe space to enjoy and grow their own produce, it's proving to be a huge success amongst others in the area. Many have found it a great way of meeting new people and it's really helped those who have felt isolated during the pandemic.

They also received some top gardening advice from Adult Education on what they can plant during the different times of the year including how to plan and manage the allotment. Due to social distancing guidelines, we provided a separate session for children so that they could also get involved in decorating and potting plants for the allotment.

It's great to see that this fantastic project is inspiring so many different generations and is helping our communities to thrive.

A real community spirit, before lockdown, Christie volunteered at two community centres: The Rock and St Paul's Community Hub. Her ability to read the room and provide one to one support to young people who are struggling to join in during group games has helped them to engage with others.

Record of aggressive behaviour towards CBH staff and contractors

At CBH we take the personal safety of our staff and our contractors very seriously. Legally, we are required to tell you that we keep a record of potentially violent and/or aggressive customers. Any incidents are recorded on a "Staff Personal Safety Register" and are accessed by CBH staff as appropriate.

In some cases, depending on the severity of the behaviour, we may also share relevant information with other partners such as the Council or Police. As stated in your tenancy agreement, it is your responsibility to make sure that you, anyone living with you, or your visitors, does not act in a violent and/or aggressive manner towards CBH staff or contractors. Failure to do this may, ultimately, result in you losing your home.
