WE'RE CALLING FOR YOUR VIEWS!

As mentioned in previous newsletters, this year we have begun a new way of asking you a few really important questions. This will help us to make better use of the information you feedback.

So far just over **500** tenants have been contacted by telephone by an expert research company called Acuity and asked a dozen questions about their perceptions of our services and their home.

This has been a huge success because it provides us with a much better understanding of how we're doing in your eyes and (most

importantly) where we're not doing so well, the reasons why we're not.

This enables us to contact the person making the feedback (where they say we can) shortly after they have responded to try and solve any issues or improve services or processes where possible.



Satisfaction with repairs and maintenance has gone up to

82%

 and we're looking at the feedback closely to understand how we can improve on this for you



Satisfaction with CBH has gone up to

89%



The percentage of tenants that were satisfied that their rent provided value for money rose to

96%



Satisfaction with the quality of your home has increased to

84%

Cheltenham gets a splash of colour

Over the weekend of 7th/8th September, Cheltenham welcomed artists from across the world to the third annual Paint Festival

One hundred artists took to the streets and transformed 25 different locations with their artistic flair - including our very own Arundel House on Princess Elizabeth Way.

Previously the Paint Festival has taken place within the town centre - but we worked closely with Cheltenham Paint Festival Director, Andy 'Dice' Davies, to bring the festival to a new audience.

The first installation was painted on Arundel House on Princess Elizabeth Way, with artist Dan Kitchener aka DANK painting the north end of the wall, and Bristol native INKIE painting the southern end closest to Coronation Square.

During the week, hundreds of passers by stopped to take pictures and talk with the artists about their work - with even more coming during the weekend to see the finished walls.

We hope to include more walls in future festivals and will be working with the paint festival organisers and local residents to look at that.

MORE NEW HOMES ON THE WAY

Following approval from Cheltenham Borough Council in July, we are pleased to announce that we are partnering up with local building company EG Carter & Co Ltd to build 27 new homes on the former Monkscroft Villas site in Hesters Way.

Work will begin this Autumn and should be completed by early 2021 to provide; a new block of flats with 1 and 2 bedrooms with a lift access and a communal terrace plus two x2 bedroom houses with parking and landscaped gardens.

The diggers are out already, and work has begun to clear the site ready for the new homes.

It's full steam ahead as our plans to build eight two bedroom semi-detached homes in Pennine Road, Oakley is underway.

The new development will compliment the existing homes surrounding the area and will include large rear gardens and off-road parking.

Following approval, the site is now ready to be cleared and we'll be working closely with J Harper and Sons who will start building the new homes at the beginning January 2020.

Once the works have been completed, the new properties will be available on HomeSeekerPlus, offering further affordable housing to Cheltenham's residents.

She also signposts to local organisations that can meet their needs by providing additional support such as food banks. Her limitless compassion for others makes her a very welcoming and approachable presence at Hesters Way Resource Centre.

Back in 2017, St Paul's Community Hub was sadly vandalised which meant that when it was reopened, there was a real need to bring people together to boost the community spirit.

This inspired the creation of a new community group known as the St Paul's SPACE Team set up to organise events for those who live in the area. Run by the residents themselves and with the support of CBH, this group has helped to reduce any isolation in the area by reaching out to people and providing them with opportunities to connect to one another. This successful scheme has inspired many local people to come together and support their neighbourhood by taking part in activities including; baking cakes, running stores and face painting.




Keeping your communities safe!

Our innovative business start-up scheme STRIVE is back for another year!

Last year we helped 17 local residents to achieve their dreams of working for themselves. On Wednesday 4 September, the FREE six week course returned with a taster session at Hesters Way Resource Centre.

The scheme is delivered by **Enterprise CUBE** – specialists in helping people to fulfil their dreams of working for themselves. They have helped over





1,200 people to set up their own businesses, ranging from landscape gardening, to floristry, cleaning companies, catering and even yoga instructing.

The course provides a unique package of training and support helping applicants to start their own businesses, no matter what their background is.

We're excited for our new Strivers as they start their journey towards fulfilling their ambitions.

Helping young people 'Thrive'

On Friday 19 July we held a graduation ceremony for young people who had completed our six month alternative provision programme, Thrive.

It was first launched in 2017 and has since been developed by our Employment Initiatives Team to help energise and inspire young people, who are at risk of being excluded, to stay in mainstream education.

This year the scheme has been run with pupils from All Saints Academy and Pittville School and six young people have taken part in a six month programme where they completed a wide range of activities and work placements specially designed for them to achieve their ASDAN Careers and Experiencing Work certificate.

The students also took part in six week work experience placements with our own responsive repairs and voids teams, as well as contractors Travis Perkins, Ian Williams, Liberty Gas and Cheltenham Flooring.

The graduation event was held at Jury's Inn and welcomed the youngsters, their families, local schools, partners and contractors who had been part of Thrive.

Congratulations to all the young people who took part in the programme and thank you to all our partners for helping to put the scheme on.

Stay fire safe in your home!

Fire safety is really important to us and to our tenants, and over the next few months there are some really important bits of advice from Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Service to take on board to keep you and your family safe.



October

Halloween is a popular time of year for kids and big kids – but it is important to make sure Halloween is safe as well as fun.

Here are a few simple measures to protect children as they trick, treat and enjoy their spooky celebrations:

- Be aware of flowing items such as fake hair and capes can, they become hazardous if they are worn near naked flames such as candles.
- Ensure that you use only fire retardant costumes for dressing up and that children can see out of masks.







- Keep children and pets away from garden candles and lanterns or any open flames. Be sure they know how to stop, drop and roll if their clothing catches fire.
- Always keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.

November







This bonfire night Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Service is encouraging people to attend one of the county's many organised events.

Licensed events are the safest way to view fireworks because they have experts who plan and design an exciting and safe display.

We would encourage tenants to consider neighbours, especially those with pets, before deciding to hold a firework display and to make sure your fireworks comply to the British Standard (BS7114 or are CE marked).



The Fire Service has prepared some tips to make sure you stay safe:

- Only allow adults to handle fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box and use them one at a time.
- Read and follow the instructions on each firework using a torch if necessary.
- Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back.
- Keep naked flames, including cigarettes, away from fireworks.
- Never return to a firework once it has been lit.
- For an emergency keep buckets of water or the garden hose close by.



- Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them.
- Direct any rocket fireworks well away from spectators.
- Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire.
- Make sure that the fire is out and surroundings are made safe before leaving.
- Keep children under supervision when using sparklers.
- Prepare a bucket of sand to dispose of used sparklers.
- Never buy fireworks from unlicensed sellers.
- Pour water on the embers before leaving.

December

There is an increased risk of fire in the home at Christmas time, so it's a good idea to check your smoke alarms are still working.

Here are Gloucestershire Fire and Rescue Service's top tips to stay safe from fire at Christmas:

- Never leave cooking unattended and avoid cooking and consuming alcohol. The majority of fires start in the kitchen so this is a high risk area. Always turn off kitchen appliances when you have finished cooking.
- If you smoke make sure cigarettes are completely extinguished before you go to bed.
- Never place candles near your Christmas tree or furnishings.

- Never leave candles unattended.
- Keep decorations, cards and wrapping paper away from candles, fires, lights and heaters, also avoid using angel hair (glass wool) together with spray on snowflakes. This combination is highly combustible.
- If you are planning to celebrate with fireworks – store them in a metal box, read the instructions, never return to a lit firework and keep a bucket of water near by.
- Take the time to check on elderly relatives and neighbours this Christmas – make sure they are fire safe.

We're delighted to announce that we've been shortlisted for the following national awards in recognition of the work we've done to support our communities:



24 Housing Awards, Innovation of the Year Category:

Our Help2 scheme has been nominated for the positive impact it has had on the lives of our tenants. It offers flexible support and a crisis fund for our colleagues to recommend any tenants in need of extra help to overcome certain hardships they may experience. Over the last two years Help2 has helped tenants decorate their homes, provide new white goods and tackle food poverty.

24 Housing Awards, Welfare Wise Category:

Our Benefit and Money Advice Team has been recognised for the efforts made to support local residents through the roll out of Universal Credit. We set up a drop-in-service at Cheltenham Jobcentre to provide advice and support to people in Cheltenham who were experiencing difficulties with Universal Credit. In the first full year alone the team helped 677 people, advising and supporting them through benefit claims and signposting to support available.

Inside Housing's Women in Housing Awards 2019:

Our Employment Initiatives Service was shortlisted for the work they do to support our tenants and the wider community by helping people get back into work through our Work Clubs.




Celebrating 100 years #morethanjusthousing

2019 marked the 100th Anniversary of the introduction of the Addison Act – where social housing was created to build homes for heroes returning from the First World War.

Since then, 5.5 million homes have been built in the UK, with Cheltenham Borough Homes managing over 4,500 properties.

At CBH we're proud of our part in bringing social housing to the town and are looking towards the future, to build more new homes for the next generation. As mentioned earlier in the magazine we have two new exciting projects at Monkscroft Villas and Holy Name Hall happening and more plans in the pipeline as we bring much needed housing to Cheltenham.





NEW Cyber Central plans

Cheltenham Borough Council announced the purchase of land to the West of Cheltenham to unlock the ambitious Cyber Central project which will bring with it thousands of jobs and new homes to the area.

CBH are one of the key partners in the project and will be working with CBC to bring brand new social housing to the town.

Record of aggressive behaviour towards CBH staff and contractors

At CBH we take the personal safety of our staff and our contractors very seriously. Legally, we are required to tell you that we keep a record of potentially violent and/or aggressive customers. Any incidents are recorded and are accessed by CBH colleagues as appropriate.

In some cases, depending on the severity of the behaviour, we may also share relevant information with other partners such as the Council or Police. As stated in your tenancy &#@% !!! %#&@ !!!

agreement, it is your responsibility to make sure that you, anyone living with you, or your visitors, does not act in a violent and/or aggressive manner towards CBH staff or contractors. Failure to do this may, ultimately, result in you losing your home.



Did you know...

Our contractor Liberty Gas carries out all of our annual gas safety checks.







Send a letter to your property, detailing the appointment date and time that the engineer will be attending. If this is not convenient, we ask you to contact them using the details below to arrange an alternative time.



You will receive an automatic text reminder normally 24hrs before your appointment if you have provided us with your current mobile number, please note this is a no-reply service.



Liberty's engineer will then call round at the arranged time to do the work. If you are not in, the engineer will leave a second card, asking you to contact again to arrange another time.

You can contact Liberty Gas 24hrs a day 7 days a week to re-book and to also advise us of any specific requirements.
